







# 2022/23 Restore-Recovering Wheatbelt Landscapes after Fire APPLICATION FORM Round 2

Applications close 5pm, Friday 11th August, 2023.

Support will be provided up to a value of  $\frac{$15,000 \text{ over Rounds } 1 \& 2}{$15,000 \text{ over Rounds } 2}$ . The on-ground project works need to be completed by June 30<sup>th</sup> 2025.

Funding is limited at a maximum of \$15,000 ex GST per farming entity, this may be applied for in Round 1, Round 2 or across both rounds.

There is a requirement for landholders to match project funds for the same \$ value in cash and/or in-kind. Therefore, if you request \$15,000 for your project, you will be required to match that amount with \$15,000 in cash and/or the value of labour, site preparation, equipment.

Please note if you received the maximum funding of \$15,000 for fencing in Round 1, you will not be eligible for further funding in Round 2.

Proponents are encouraged to read the Project Guidelines prior to completing their application.

#### **About The Project**

Bushfires in early 2022 have wrought extensive damage across 60,000ha of the Wheatbelt.

One of the greatest natural resource impacts has been the loss of many years of conservation and sustainable agriculture activities undertaken by landholders in the region.

The impacted communities are leaders in sustainable land management and in their commitment to conserving our natural environment. Some of these landholders have lost 20 years and more worth of revegetation, both biodiverse and perennial shrubs as well as the damage to remnant vegetation.

This project will support farmers who demonstrate a commitment to landscape restoration to restore the amenity and ecological function of their properties by restoring remnant vegetation.
