

Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes Project 2016-2020

PROJECT CODE: HE2RED

Project Overview

This project uses a coordinated grass roots approach to threat mitigation of feral vertebrates across the South West of WA.

Local communities are supported to undertake control programs at key times of the year in the context of a larger coordinated program. Under the program, landcare and other local groups hold events where volunteers come together to control foxes, rabbits, cats and other feral species.

Outcomes:

This year, the Summer/Autumn season of SSAAWA Red Card for Rabbits and Foxes began in February with events continuing into March 2019.


January to March 2019

- 25 community cull events held prior 31 March
- 4607 feral animals culled
- 15 posts on Red Card Facebook page with a range of people reached between 550 and 6700, with an average active engagement of 162 people per post.
